What Does It Entail?

- 1. An evaluation of social, economic and environmental effects of a proposed action, including measures to mitigate adverse effects.
- 2. Consideration of a reasonable range of alternatives
- 3. Opportunities for public and agency engagement throughout process

An EIS involves an informed decision-making process based on a balanced consideration of transportation needs, including safety, and social, economic and environmental effects.
